



SIMPLY BOOT CUFFS

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The "Simply Boot Cuffs" pattern is the foundational boot cuff set in the "Simply" series of crochet patterns. This series is a collection of very structurally basic designs that were created for four simple purposes.

1. To enable **BEGINNERS** to create aesthetically & functionally high-end designs that are simplistic in principle, with minimal skill requirements.
2. To enable **KNITTERS** to cross over & easily access crochet in a clear, uncluttered, and uncomplicated format.
3. To take **ADVANCED** and **INTERMEDIATE** crocheters into a highly prolific space, by giving you an arsenal of well designed, easy, go-to patterns.
4. To create a landscape where all 3 groups can learn foundational structures where the process has been pared down, enabling you to easily create your own designs & patterns based on these simplistic foundations and techniques.

YOU WILL NEED:

- *150 -180 yd/138-165m of worsted weight yarn in the color of your choice,
- *Hook: 5mm/H-8 or size needed to obtain gauge
- *Yarn needle
- *Optional: Button
- *Optional: An additional 2 yd/1.8m of yarn in a contrasting color to sew the button on with.

STITCHES USED:

Chain (ch)
Half double crochet (hdc)

GAUGE:

16 hdc = 4"/10cm
8 rows = 4"/10cm

PATTERN NOTES:

To create the rib stitch effect, the scarf is worked using half double crochet stitches, worked in the back loops only.

SIZING:

The pattern below will yield a cuff that is 6 inches high with a 12 inch circumference. If you would like to adjust the circumference, to make a customized size, each row equals a half inch. ex. If you want to add 2 inches to the circumference, add 4 additional rows. If you want to subtract 1 inch, work 2 fewer rows.

THE BOOT CUFFS:

(make 2)

With the yarn of your choice, hdc 27.

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across (25 hdc).

Row 2: Ch 2, turn, worked in the back loops only, hdc in each hdc across.

Rows 3-24: Repeat Row 2. Fasten off.



Carefully line up the edges as pictured, and use your yarn needle to whip stitch the edges together. Fasten off, and weave in your ends.

Optional, Use a contrasting color of your choice, to sew on buttons as pictured.
