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SIMPLY A CAPELET

Simply series is a collection of structurally, very basic designs that were created for four simple purposes.

1. To enable **BEGINNERS** to create aesthetically & functionally high-end designs that are simplistic in principle, with minimal skill requirements.
2. To enable **KNITTERS** to cross over & easily access crochet in a clear, uncluttered, and uncomplicated format.
3. To take Advanced and intermediate crocheters into a highly prolific space, by providing an arsenal of well designed, easy, go-to patterns.
4. To create a landscape where all 3 groups can learn foundational structures - where the process has been pared down, enabling you to easily create your own designs & patterns based on these simplistic foundation and techniques.

FINISHED SIZE: 36" wide x 8" long (91.44 cm x 20.32 cm)

YOU WILL NEED

- Worsted Weight Yarn in Your Color of Choice
(3.5 ounces, 170 yards (100 grams, 156 meters) per skein):
2 skeins
- Crochet hook sizes K (6.5mm) or size needed for gauge
- Yarn needle
- Button of your choice

NOTE:

Work in sps between sts throughout.

STITCHES USED

Chain (ch)
Half double crochet (hdc)
Double crochet (dc)

GAUGE:

With size K hook, 12dc and
6 rows = 4" (10 cm)

CAPELET

With size K hook and Yarn, ch 84.

Row 1: Hdc in third ch from hook (2 skipped chs count as first hdc) and in each ch across: 83 hdc.

Row 2: (Right Side): Ch 3, turn; (skip next hdc, 2 dc in next hdc) across to last 2 hdc, skip next hdc, dc in last hdc: 82 sts.

Note: Loop a short piece of yarn around any stitch to mark Row 2 as right side.

Row 3: Ch 3, turn: skip next dc, 2 dc in sp before next dc, (skip next 2 dc, 2 dc in sp before next dc) across to last dc, skip last dc and next ch, dc in next ch.

Row 4: Ch 3, turn; skip next dc, 2 dc in sp before next dc, (skip next 2 dc, 2 dc in sp before next dc) across to last dc, skip last dc and next ch, dc in next ch.

Rows 5 - 11: Repeat Row 4

RUFFLEE EDGING

Row 1: Ch 4, turn; 2 tr (treble crochet) in first sp, and in each sp across: finish off.

ADDING A BUTTON CLOSURE

Sew your button of choice onto the corner of Row 1, and use the spaces between your stitching as your built in button holes.
