

SIMPLY A FLOWERY SCARF

Simply A Flowery Scarf Pattern is a simple, yet elegant design, that is written in an easy to follow format.

The scarf is very versatile, and easy to customize. It can be created in any variety of colors, and the flowers can be sewn in place, or they can be sewn onto finbacks, so they can be easily moved around.

YOU WILL NEED

180yd/165m of bulky weight yarn in the color of your choice, for the body 40yd/37m of worsted weight yarn in the color of your choice for each flower. Hook: 55mm/I-9 and 10mm/N-15 or size needed to obtain gauge Yarn needle

Optional: Pinbacks

STITCHES USED

Chain (ch) Half double crochet (hdc) Double crochet (dc) Single crochet (sc) Slip stitch (sl st)

GAUGE:

Please take the time to check your gauge!

10 dc = 4"/10 cm with larger hook6 rows= 4"/10cm with larger hook 1 flower = 3"/8cm diameter with smaller hook

PATTERN NOTES

Double crochet stitches are worked in the spaces between stitches, not in the tops of stitches. The last space is between the last stitch and the beginning chain of the previous row.

SCARF BODY

With larger hook and A, ch 20

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across (18 hdc).

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, dc in each space between sts across (18dc).

Row 3: Ch2, turn, hdc in each space between sts across.

Repeat Row 2 and 3 until piece measures 34"/86 cm. Fasten off.

FLOWERS

(Make as many as you'd like, in as many colors as you would like. For fluffier flowers, use the larger hook, for more subtle flowers, use the smaller hook.)

Ch 3; Join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout) work 7 more dc in ring, join with sl st in top of beginning ch-3 (8dc).

as dc, ch 2), *dc in next dc, ch 2; repeat from * around, join with sl st in in 3rd ch of beginning ch-5 (8 ch-2 spaces). Rnd 2: Ch 5 (counts

Rnd 3 (back petals): SI st into first ch-2 space around (8 pedals).

Rnd 4: Working in front of Rnd 3 petals, *sl st around post of nextdc of Rnd 1, ch 2; repeat from *around; join with sl st in first sl st 8ch-2 spaces.

Fasten off leaving a 12"/31cm end for sewing.

FINISHING OPTIONS

You can sew each flower onto a pinback, or, using the photographs as your guide, you can sew the finished flowers onto the scarf body. Weave in all yarn ends.
